## Preparing to Reopen the Nursery and School

I am writing to update you on our plans to begin to reopen from the Nursery and School from the start of June. However, before I do so, I want to acknowledge that this has been a challenging time for children and adults alike. The constraints of sheltering at home and the disruption to our usual routines have had a profound effect on all of us.

Firstly, I want to pay tribute to the School's staff who have made many wide-ranging adjustments to the way they work to support children both in school and at home. As a team and as individuals they have been superb.

Secondly, I want to reassure you that the safety of all children and all adults is our priority. Keeping everyone safe will be at the forefront of our minds in every decision we make.

Thirdly, I want to thank you for the understanding, patience and kindness that you have shown throughout this time to each other and the School. Over the past weeks I have seen and heard many acts of kindness across the community. I have been reminded of the quote by Ernest Hemmingway, "Courage is grace under pressure".

## Changes Ahead – A Phased Approach

Following on from the announcements this week by the Prime Minister we now know that infant schools are to welcome back children in the **Nursery** and **Reception** classes only from **1<sup>st</sup> June**. It is hoped that children in other year groups will also be able to return later in the term.

We are currently working to develop a clear plan so we can do this safely, following the government's guidance which is informed by scientific advice.

We know that young children will not be able to follow social distancing guidelines in school and so we will limit groupings to a maximum of 15 children. We will assign adults to work with the same group each day in the same space, creating a "bubble" of children and adults.

We will plan to keep each 'bubble' separate from the other 'bubbles' in the school by staggering the daily timetables for each bubble, including the timings of arrival and collection and practical adjustments. We will implement a thorough cleaning regime across the school and have clear protocols in place to manage children and adults in the event that they become unwell while on site.

At the same time, we will continue to support the children of Key Workers and other children with specific vulnerabilities (EHCP and Social Care).

Any changes will be fully considered in detail and conditional on updated guidance and safety advice before they are implemented. We are in close communication with the Local Authority and we are actively liaising with professional bodies to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our staff team.

Understandably, it is going to take a few days to finalise a robust plan to open the school. Once it is complete and it has approved by the School's Governing Board and the Local Authority I will share it with you in detail.

For now, please continue to make the most of your time together at home as best you can. Teachers will continue to contact you directly each week, they are preparing the next updates for children's Home Learning packs and watch out for our daily Book Club videos on YouTube.
